Boren Scholarship: Summer, semester, and year-long study in regions critical to US national security. Requires one-year commitment to serve in national security governmental position. Campus deadline: early December. Advisor: Peter Morello.

Critical Languages Scholarship: US State Department funded eight-week summer language institutes abroad in critical-need languages. Self-nomination. National deadline: November. Advisors: Kate Wozniak and Natalie Gilkison.

DAAD Scholarship: Wide variety of summer, semester and yearlong internships, study and research opportunities in all fields in Germany. Deadlines vary. Some require university endorsement. Advisor: Peter Morello.

Fulbright Grant: Cultural exchange funded by US State Department. One-year post-undergraduate fellowship for research, study, or teaching English abroad. Campus deadline: late August. Advisor: Peter Morello.

UK Fulbright Summer Programs: Three, four, or five-week academic and cultural summer programs for freshmen and sophomores. Self-nomination. Deadline: late February. Advisor: Peter Morello.

Gates-Cambridge Scholarship: Post-undergraduate study at Cambridge University in all fields. Must show evidence of commitment to improving lives of others. Self-nomination. National Deadline: mid-October. Advisor: Jim McKusick.

Gilman Scholarship: Up to \$5,000 in funding for credit-bearing study abroad, especially to non-traditional destinations, for students receiving Pell Grants. Deadlines vary. Study Abroad and Fin Aid certification required. Advisors: Kate Wozniak and Natalie Gilkison.

Goldwater Scholarship: \$7,500 for up to two years of undergraduate study in STEM fields. Research experience required. Up to four nominees per year. Campus deadline: late October. Advisor: Fred Leibsle.

Marshall Scholarship: Funding for graduate study anywhere in the UK in all fields. Must have exceptional academic and leadership potential. Requires four letters of recommendation. Campus deadline: April. Advisor: Jim McKusick.

Mitchell Scholarship: One-year post-graduate study in Ireland in all fields. Three selection criteria: scholarship; leadership; and sustained commitment to service and community. Campus deadline: April. Advisor: Jim McKusick.

Pickering Foreign Affairs Fellowship: Provides mentoring and professional development to prepare students for a U.S. Department of State Foreign Service career. Self-nomination. National deadline: mid-January. Advisor: Mona Lyne.

Rhodes Scholarship: Graduate study at Oxford University in all fields. Applicants should demonstrate leadership and the will to "fight the world's fight" and should have 5-8 strong recommendations. Campus deadline: April. Advisor: Jim McKusick.

Truman Scholarship: \$30,000 for graduate or professional school for juniors committed to making a difference through public service. Selection based on academics, service and leadership. Campus deadline: October. Advisor: Debra Leiter.

Udall Scholarship: \$7,000 to sophomores and juniors committed to making significant contributions to the fields of the environment, tribal health or tribal governance. Campus deadline: November. Advisor: Caroline Davies.
